Welcome again, we have exciting news to share with our readers in this addition of the Tattler. The first headline to share with you, and some may already know, was our successful application for a federal grant of \$500,000. The announcement of our success was made by Dr John McVeigh, Federal Member for Groom during a recent visit to our facility. See cover page and page 10

The funding is part of the Aged Care Regional, Rural and Remote Infrastructure Grant Scheme. The funds will be used to refurbish a number of the lodge rooms which will include much needed ensuite makeovers as well as reconfiguring the joinery in the bedrooms to provide better and safer access to the ensuites as well as the rooms themselves.

The Lodge was commissioned in 1989 and while structurally sound and still very appealing, the rooms are a little tired and do not lend themselves to the provision of high care that an increasing number of our residents need. We are very excited about being awarded this grant and are looking forward starting the work.

The other exciting news is our successful Re-accreditation site audit that was held from the Tuesday 5th to Thursday 7th of February. Every three years aged care facilities such as ours undergo a re-accreditation assessment to ensure we are maintaining the high quality standard required to maintain our accreditation, receive Government funding so we can provide care to our residents.

One major difference with this year is the site audit visit was unannounced. This means the assessors arrive at the facility at any time within a certain timeframe. I'm pleased to say that we were successful in meeting all 44 outcomes of the Aged Care Quality Standards. To ensure we continue to meet these standards the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission will continue to make at least one unannounced visit every year, as they do with every Government funded aged care facility.

Further to this regulatory function, as from 1 January 2019 the Aged Care Quality Agency and the Aged Care Complaints Commission have combined to form a single body titled the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission. The Government believes that combining the 2 functions will provide a more timely and effective response to quality and care issues. Also from 1 July this year the Aged Care Quality Standards will change to provide a holistic approach to quality across the age care sectors such as home support, home care and residential care. We will provide more information as we get closer to the transition.

## Charter of Care Recipients' Rights and Responsibilities Aged Care Act 1997, Schedule 1 User Rights Principles 2014

#### Care recipients' rights-residential care

#### 1. Each care recipient has the following rights:

to full and effective use of his or her personal, civil, legal and consumer rights;

- to quality care which is appropriate to his or her needs;
- to full information about his or her own state of health and about available treatments;



to live without discrimination or victimisation, and without being obliged to feel grateful to

those providing his or her care and accommodation;

to personal privacy;

to live in a safe, secure and homelike environment, and to move freely both within and outside the residential care service without undue restriction;

to be treated and accepted as an individual, and to have his or her individual preferences taken into account and treated with respect;

to continue his or her cultural and religious practices and to retain the language of his or her choice, without discrimination;

to select and maintain social and personal relationships with any other person without fear, criticism or restriction;

to freedom of speech;

to maintain his or her personal independence, which includes a recognition of personal responsibility for his or her own actions and choices, even though some actions may involve an element of risk which the resident has the right to accept, and that should then not be used to prevent or restrict those actions;

to maintain control over, and to continue making decisions about, the personal aspects of his or her daily life, financial affairs and possessions;

to be involved in the activities, associations and friendships of his or her choice, both within and outside the residential care service;

to have access to services and activities which are available generally in the community;

to be consulted on, and to choose to have input into, decisions about the living arrangements of the residential care service;

to have access to information about his or her rights, care, accommodation, and any other information which relates to him or her personally;

to complain and to take action to resolve disputes;

to have access to advocates and other avenues of redress; and

to be free from reprisal, or a well-founded fear of reprisal, in any form for taking action to enforce his or her rights.

#### 2. Each resident of a residential care service has the responsibility:

- to respect the rights and needs of other people within the residential care service, and to respect the needs of the residential care service community as a whole;
- to respect the rights of staff and the proprietor to work in an environment which is free from harassment; to care for his or her own health and well-being, as far as he or she is capable; and
- to inform his or her medical practitioner, as far as he or she is able, about his or her relevant medical history and his or her current state of health.
